the establishment of the Israeli Biometric Database, including representing the appellants to the supreme court to quash the biometric database. Adv. Klinger is the manager of the anti-SLAPP clinic in the Ono Academic Center, which aims to protect the freedom of expression over for civil activists. Klinger has also authored a research about fair-use in Israel and has been one of the people advocating net-neutrality. In 2009, following to Mr. Klinger's research on traffic shaping, it was found that Israeli ISPs not only throttle P2P traffic, but also cache P2P content.
