

For the past 10 years **Paula Martins** has worked on freedom of expression and information issues as a regional director for ARTICLE 19. She is also a member of the International Council of IFEX – Freedom of Expression Exchange.

Paula participated in the drafting and public debates surrounding the approval of important legislation in

Brazil, such as the Brazilian Rtl Law and the Marco Civil da Internet (Civil Rights Framework for the Internet, progressive piece of legislation promoting digital rights). She has also engaged in litigation in key cases concerning censorship, the right to protest and government transparency, among others, before national and international courts and bodies.

Paula has a Bachelor's degree in Law from the University of Sao Paulo (USP) and a Master degree in Public Interest Law from the New York University (NYU). For eighteen years she has worked on a variety of human rights issues and have held professional posts in different types of organizations. Previous work experience includes posts at the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Human Rights Watch, Conectas Human Rights, European Roma Rights Centre, Federacion Internacionale de Droit de l'Homme and the OAS Human Rights Commission.

Paula has also worked as a consultant for UNESCO, UNDP and the UN OHCHR.
