



**Stefano Fantin** obtained his degrees in Italy (University of Trieste Law School) and the Netherlands (TILT– Tilburg Institute for Law, Technology and Society at Tilburg Law School), where he specialized in the intersection between law, technology and security. Back then, he focused on the

public sector, namely law enforcement, national security and e-Government. Under such auspices, he conducted research on subjects such as cyber security and data protection. He counts his first professional experiences as a trainee at Europol and at the European Data Protection Supervisor. He then joined the British Government at the Cabinet Office, where he was assigned at the Government Digital Service task-force, serving the functions of Analyst. As a civil servant in Whitehall, he was involved in governmental compliance and policy making on digital transformation laws and strategies, touching upon a number of files such as GDPR implementation, National Cyber Security Strategy, United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union. As an expert in public policy on privacy and cybersecurity matters, he has been an external contributor for the London-based think tank WonkBridge.

Since October 2017, Stefano is a Researcher Associate at the Center for IT & IP Law in the Catholic University of Leuven (KU Leuven), where he conducts research projects on technologies for intelligence analysis and counter-terrorism, as well as on cyber security strategic development. He is currently in the Doctoral Program of the KU Leuven Law School, researching on national security cyber policies. In Brussels, he is an independent member of the Cyber Security Task Force at the think-tank CEPS – Center for EU Policy Studies, working on cyber defense issues.
